Hinton Summery Recipe - Peach Melba (serves 4)

- 4 ripe peaches, peeled, stoned & sliced
- 8 scoops vanilla ice cream
- 375g (12oz) fresh raspberries
- approx. 4 tbs icing sugar

Update on the 2019 'Gardens Open' Weekend

I am writing to everyone again to report on the weekend and on behalf of the PCC and congregation of St Peter's Church to thank everyone who gave their support, assistance, or opened their gardens. Our thanks in particular go to Mr & Mrs Pitt-Rivers for opening their own garden and for allowing the use of the Tithe Barn, together with our major sponsors, Harts of Stur, Symonds & Sampson, The Southern Co-operative Society and Wessex Water and all the other businesses and individuals who gave financial sponsorship and gifts.

The weather was thankfully very kind to us after much rain and wind in recent weeks and just over 600 people attended over the two days. The teas were as usual a great success and the books, "shabby chic" and plant stalls were busy with visitors buying their bargains and the tombola was very popular and consequently ran out of prizes very quickly. Once again, we were entertained with music from "Strings Attached" led by our own John Harding. New for this year was a small display of pictures and items relating to the Hinton St Mary Mosaic and a number of children enjoyed making mosaics, with prizes provided by the Blackmore Vale Arts Society.

I can confirm that on rough figures, we have exceeded our net profit after costs compared with 2017, which is amazing given the rather variable weather and the many other events going on at the same time. These funds will greatly assist in meeting the budgeted costs in the region of £16,000 required for urgent repairs needed on the Church in the next 12 months.
