Norma Bonell lent me a couple of memoirs written by Rebe Chinn which dates from 1908. She lived in Twinwood Farm now known as Twinwood Cottage and later at Castelman's, and the other by Mrs Ada Chapple, nee Ada Creese from 1921 to 1938. The Creese family were tenant farmers living in Nicholson's Farm house

Curates Corner

On the second Sunday of every month at St Peter's we have a "Family Service" A Family Service has a different feel to the other services we have on other Sundays.

A Family Service is like a family meal, which is not the same as a children's party or an adult dinner party.

Children's parties are geared completely for children, and the adults involved adjust their behaviour accordingly to fit in with the party. Adult dinner parties are geared for adults who have been invited. Children are not normally included, but if they are present they are expected to fit in with the needs of the occasion.

Family meals, however, are for everyone - from the youngest to the oldest -and should be relaxed, enjoyable and satisfying for them all.

At our Family Services we are aiming for the "Family Meal" type of experience. (There are other times of worship when the "Children's Party" or "Adult Dinner Party" are the appropriate style to follow).

Rather like a menu, the service contains a main course that is something which nearly everyone will like, with a variety of other dishes that will appeal specifically to different members of the family. Special provision is made for babies, and anyone else for whom the main course is not suitable.

The range of talking can be very wide - from laughing and joking, to serious issues that need to be discussed. And just as anything can happen when a family gets together, so there is room for the unexpected!

The Next Family Service will be at 10am on February 9th.


