As our children and young people prepare to go back to school its that time again when we flap about trying to find school shoes and missing text books. Many of you will know Dorothy L Law's poem "Children Learn What They Live" written in 1959.

Less well known is her subsequent work for teenagers written in 2002.



*If teenagers live with pressure they learn to be stressed.*

*If teenagers live with failure they learnt to give up.*

*If teenagers live with rejection they learnt to feel lost.*

*If teenagers live with too many rules they learnt to get round them.*

*If teenagers live with too few rules they learn to ignore the needs of others.*

*BUT*

*If teenagers live with respect they learn to honour others*

*If teenagers live with trust they learnt to tell the truth*

*If teenagers live with openness they learnt to discover themselves*

*If teenagers live with positive expectations they learn to build a better world.*



Never mind teenagers – this applies to us all whatever stage in life we are. As universal truths no claim can be made by Christianity for these ideas. But Christians would add that there is a deeper and greater dimension to the ideas expressed here: that when you add loving God to the list it subtly changes things. A new dimension is added of a perfect example of love and kindness and self giving shown in Jesus Christ.
